WATER SYSTEM Our water treatment facility is managed by **King Water.** If you have questions about water quality, feel free to call them at 360-678-5336. For <u>after-hours water emergency</u>, please contact <u>888-266-7048</u>. Charge-backs from King Water for residential investigation call outs requested by members will be passed on to the customer. Remember to call King Water for emergencies, not residential maintenance. For billing inquires, continue to call the Rolling Hills Glencairn Office at 360-678-7446.

The **COMMUNITY DOCK, BEACH AND PIER** are private membership amenities available for your enjoyment. To access them, you will need a keycard. If you don't have one yet, simply contact the office. Limit 1 per household. The float will return by Memorial Day weekend and will remain in place through Labor Day. This facility is for **day use only**, and there is no overnight moorage.

Water System Update:

By the time this is received, the new filtration system should be up and running at Rolling Hills-Glencairn! Our cutting-edge treatment system features a **biological filtration method** that will harnesses the power of naturally occurring bacteria to tackle contaminants like ammonia. How does this new system work? Let's dive into the details—

Nitrification is the heart of biological filtration. It involves naturally occurring **bacteria** that are already present in the water. These bacteria perform a two-step process. First, they convert ammonia (NH_4) and oxygen (O_2) into **nitrite** (NO_2). Next, they transform the nitrite into **nitrate** (NO_3). The entire process uses about **4.5 milligrams of oxygen (O_2)** for every milligram of **ammonium nitrogen (NH_4-N)** present in the water. Aeration is essential for any biological ammonia treatment system, ensuring sufficient oxygen supply for the bacteria.

How It Works: Imagine a granular-packed column acting as a bed. Water flows through this column, allowing the naturally occurring bacteria to thrive. As water passes through, these bacteria efficiently remove ammonia, promoting cleaner water. Benefits:

- **Natural**: Biological filtration leverages the power of nature's own microorganisms.
- Cost-Effective: It's relatively economical compared to some other methods.
- Ammonia Removal: By reducing ammonia through biological filtration, chlorine levels are more stable. This means less chlorine or other chemical disinfectants are required to maintain safe water quality.

So, in a nutshell, biological filtration relies on the remarkable abilities of bacteria to improve water quality. By harnessing nature's microorganisms, it creates healthier water for everyone. However, it's essential to remember that this method does not soften the water. You may want to consider additional filtration systems for your home.

To contribute to the study of strategies for controlling Disinfection By-Products (DBPs). The WA **DOH** will analyze water samples to shape future testing regulations and requirements.
